Camp Kineowatha- the Girls camp that was once our neighbor and how its closing affected Kawanhee history.

Many boys camps in Maine are located in an area near a girls camp or a "sister " camp. Some are even owned by the same person, family or company. Kawanhee is located many miles from the nearest girls camp, but that wasn't always the case. For the first 50 years of our history, a popular girls camp was located in Wilton, Maine- the next town over from Weld, about 10 miles away. This, of course, afforded many opportunities for Kawanhee and Kineowatha to share in some social activities. We always had a mixed tennis tournament on a Sunday afternoon at Kineowatha. I remember this because I once hit my partner in the back of my head with a serve. I swear it was an accident. And a few times each summer we had dances. I remember these quite well. I remember that we had strange dances that were supposed to get people to interact. I remember the shoe dance. Everyone put one of their shoes in the center of the dance floor. You picked out a shoe-looked for its owner and that was your dance partner. I often picked out my brother's BA's shoe, but that was ok; we needed to get closer.

As you might expect, several Kawanhee and Kineowatha counselors began to have romantic relationships and I know of one couple that ended up getting married. On a night out from Kawanhee, a counselor could drive over to Kineowatha and meet a girl in their counselor room and enjoy some conversation or go out for a pizza. Many Kawanhee families would send female family members to Kineowatha. Liz Standen was a Kineowatha camper and even Liz's mother was a camper there. Kate Estabrook Schoedinger was also a Kineowatha camper. There were a lot of others.

Unfortunately, Camp Kineowatha closed in the late 1960s or early 1970s. The family that owned Camp Kineowatha also owned a boys camp in New York. I believe it was called Camp Idlewild. The owners decided to also close Camp Idlewild. Several boys from the country of Spain had attended Camp Idlewild and they suddenly had no camp to attend. Camp Kawanhee was recommended to these Spanish families and that is how the first boys from Spain came to Kawanhee. Now hundreds of boys from Spain have attended Kawanhee , including King Felipe VI.





A few years after the closing of Camp Kineowatha, the town of Wilton bought the property and it is now a lovely town park.




Kayaking the Androscoggin by Phil Coons


