Monhegan Island was an interesting trip. I only went on the second trip so I will tell you about that one.


The trip there was okay except for the people in the Bouncing Buggy who almost froze to death. The boat ride there was great. I don't think anyone got sick!

We are having a great year in soccer and we are following a good pace in both working for the units and soccer matches.



Mount Washington


