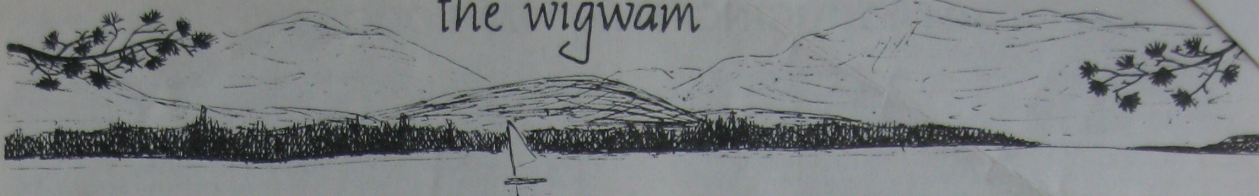

## CROW AND BADGER FIRST TO CLIMB TUMBLEDOWN

Trips began on Wednesday of camp's first week after a two-day moratorium in order to get in-camp activities off the ground. The beginning trip schedule calls for each of the twelve lodge groups to day-climb a local mountain. The tripping season opened with a Tumbledown climb, via the challenging Chimney Trail, for Crow's Nest and Badger lodges. Mike Duncan came away with the distinction of being the first Kawanhee camper of '79 to swim in Crater Lake, a clear and very brisk pond that nestles among Tumbledown's peaks.

The following day, Bear Lodge tackled Tumbledown from its other side by way of Little Jackson. Friday, the Eagles and Falcons made a spirited go of Bald Mountain with views and lunch on top.

Clouds were threatening on Monday, so we took Lynx and Wildcat lodges to the Andover Earth Station about 35 miles from camp. Andover is one of six locations in the United States with tracking and transmitting capabilities for the world's communications satellites. A tour guide plus a movie helped us to appreciate the work load of satellites and earth stations. Then we headed to Frye Brook for lunch. Frye's falls and ledges met us just one mile in on the Appalachian Trail, and they made for some excellent exploring.

Tuesday morning delivered a blue sky and a stiff gap breeze, so we headed off to Mt. Blue with Hawk lodge. Co-directors Standen and Yale are looking forward to a few more day-climbs and the overnight trips which will soon begin.
