Maroons Soar To Victory In '68

A combination of the "Golden Rule" and the "Maroon Ruhle" was an unbeatable combination this 1968 Kawanhee season. Tom Ruhle and his Maroons gained momentum during the last two weeks of activities and merged some 2600 points victorious over their rivals, the Greys.

Before each competitive activity of the weekend, Tom and his Maroons would march in mass through the camp singing "Oh, when the points are read by Del, the Maroons will go marching on", and on they marched to the tune of 25,766 points for the season.

However, Tim McKee and his Greys have no reason to hang their heads as they were not dragging their feet entirely. They, too, were gaining strength as the season rolled on but they just couldn't overcome the deficit of the previous weeks. As Tim told his Greys, "Even though we have lost in points, we have all won something at Kawanhee. Let's just hope that we have given as much to Kawanhee as Kawanhee has given to us. There must be a winner and a loser in competitive activities, but you Greys have all been winners to me."

It was a good thing that Tom Ruhle had thanked his Maroons for their summer's work at the beginning of the Awards Ceremony, as he didn't have a chance to do much but hold his breath when Del read the final score as his Maroons gave him the victory "dunking". Usually just the captain takes the dunking but the Maroons were so happy that several teammates took the plunge too.

To end the season in the usual Kawanhee spirit, the Maroons gave the Greys a cheer that echoed around the lake. Then to add to their own celebration, they gave themselves a rousing victory cheer that would have registered as a small earthquake on any seismograph.

The 48th season at Kawanhee ended with a score of 25,766 points for the Maroons and 23,162 points for the Greys, and as Tim said, everyone was a winner at Kawanhee this season.

Frank Stewart Leads Assault On Katahdin

Bright and early on Monday, August 12th, 16 campers and 4 staff members left for Katahdin. After a very eventful trip, punctuated with seeing a moose calf cross the road and disappear into the underbrush in front of us and having a two-hour delay with tire trouble, we arrived at Roaring Brook Campsite in Baxter State Park at 6:00. We all cooperated and before long we had the truck unloaded and everyone assigned to a bunk.

Frank Stewart and Ed Chace soon had a delicious dinner of tomato soup, hamburgers, corn on the cob (Maine), and for dessert, canned peaches. After K.P. duty, we were all ready to bed down for the night as we knew that we had a big day ahead of us.

Tuesday morning was a perfect day for our arduous task of climbing Katahdin. The campers and staff fortified them-

selves with juice, oatmeal, bacon and eggs and cocoa. At about 8:30 we left Roaring Brook Campsite with Frank Stewart leading and Mr. McCleave bringing up the rear for the first leg of our hike, Chimney Pond which is located at the foot of Katahdin. This was a gentle, but steady uphill journey of 3.3 miles through woods and up a dry stream bed. We arrived at Chimney Pond about 10:00 a.m. This was good time. After a brief stop, we signed the register for those who are to climb Katahdin. We also refreshed ourselves with a drink of pure mountain spring water. We then headed for the mountain.

Katahdin loomed above us like a mighty giant and we felt like giant-killers! Frank led us up the Dudley Trail knowing that this 1.25 miles to the peak of Pamola would tax our complete efforts. We had climbed a little over 15 minutes, when Eric Etherington, who was climbing directly in front of Mr. McCleave, turned his ankle. Needless to say, Frank and Mr. McCleave held a "council of war". Frank took over the task of getting Eric back down the mountain and Mr. McCleave assumed the lead. We struggled over boulders and it wasn't long before Frank had returned from his difficult responsibility and he assumed the leader's role. We climbed a wee bit faster with Frank leading and cheering us on. The view all the way up was spectacular. It seemed that when we looked down we were climbing at least an 85 degree angle. Just before noon, we reached the summit of Pamola Peak which is 4,902 feet high.

Then on we climbed through the Eye of the Needle to the Chimney Peak. We stopped here for our lunch and a good rest. We then tackled the Knife Edge. This is one of the most spectacular rock formations in the East. The campers under Frank's direction used extreme caution while traveling over this part of the trail. Many of the lads traversed this area on hands and knees as the wind was blowing at almost a gale. We soon reached South Peak, 5,240 ft., where we rested before our final assault on Baxter Peak. We reached Baxter Peak, 5,257 ft., at about 2:00 p.m. The view from Baxter Peak is awe inspiring. We could see mountains in all directions and studded in the mountains were literally hundreds of ponds, lakes, and far off we could see the Atlantic Ocean. We could see Chimney Pond far below us shimmering like a jewel in the sun. We met many folks on Baxter Peak. It seemed as if everyone was climbing Katahdin.

We used the Cathedral Trail on our journey down the mountain. This trail was a wee bit more gentle than Dudley, but it was also a trail that had several rock slides and we had to show extreme caution. We came down in about 2 hours. We again stopped at the Ranger Station at Chimney Pond to rest and refresh ourselves with delicious spring water. We then started our long, monotonous journey to Roaring Brook Campsite. This journey took us two hours.

The last hikers arrived at the bunkhouse at 6:10, tired, hungry, but happy with the knowledge that we had climbed a great mountain. We soon had dinner cooked by Mr. Bateman and Ed Chace. We all enjoyed a delicious "Bates" stew topped off with apple pie and ice cream.

The boys had a great time looking for moose and several were seen. Craig Miller, Dean Miller's grandson, was chased up a tree by an angry cow moose when he tried to take her calf's picture. We had a good trip home to camp. Bates treated us all to a delicious custard and we arrived back at camp tired, happy and in the need of a good shower.
