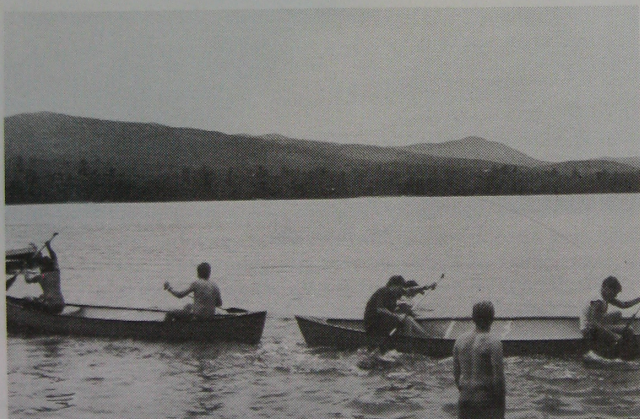


FUN CONTINUES AS KAWANHEE '86 NEARS COMPLETION!

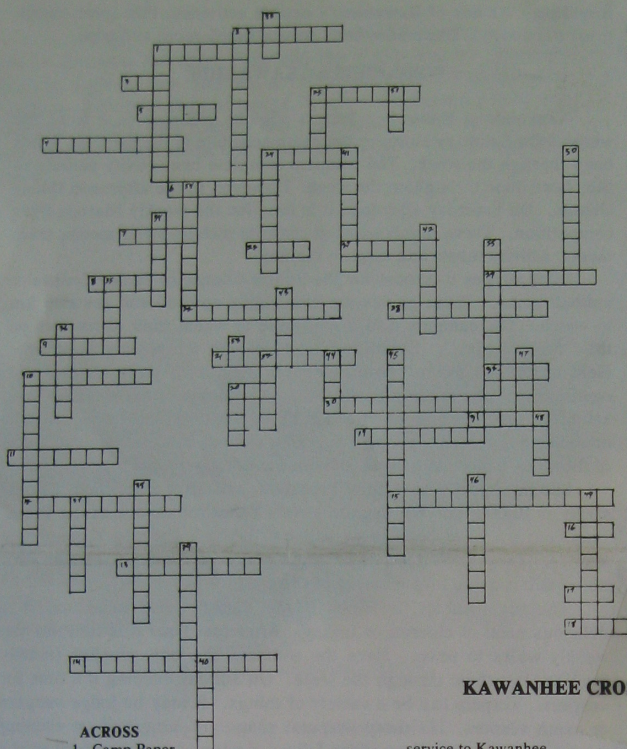

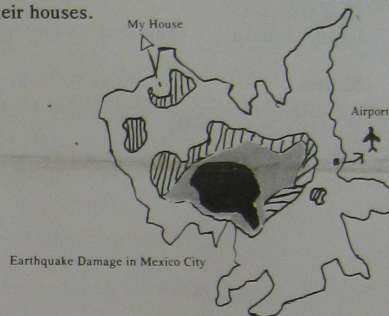
On September 19, 1985, a devastating earthquake struck Mexico City. One of our campers, Andres Banos, lives in Mexico City. Below is his eyewitness account of that day.

EARTHQUAKE

This was a normal morning in Mexico City on September 19 at 7:19 when I felt a strange thing. At first I thought that I was sick. The house rocked and a lamp fell down. That's when I started to get scared. Water from the swimming pool splashed out, and I just ran out of the house and then it stopped. At first I was scared but I didn't think that the earthquake was very bad because I don't have too much building near my house and I don't live near the center of the city. But when they canceled the classes and I went into the center and I saw all that buildings destroyed I knew that the city was very bad. And I didn't go to school for a whole week because they were checking all the schools because a lot of them came down. Now they have cleaned up all the destroyed buildings and they have reconstructed houses for all the people that lost their houses.
