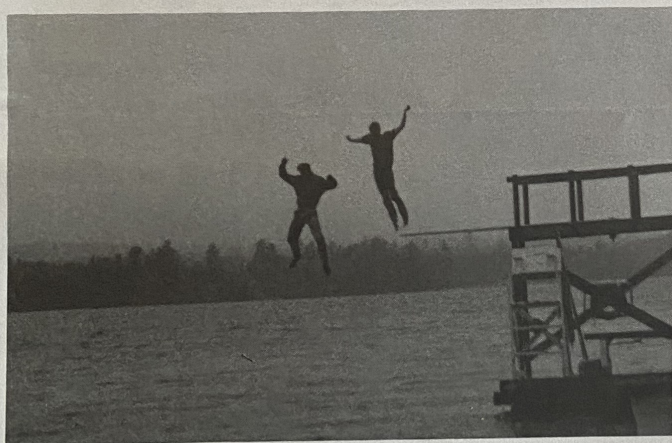

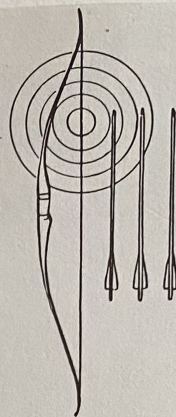

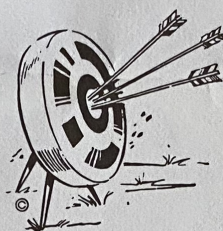

## Wrestling

The last couple of weeks of wrestling were fantastic. With so many other activities going on it was difficult to organize and schedule the all-camp tournament. However, boys were weighed, put into weight classes and the competition began. The lightest of the wrestlers was Todd Altfater. He had only one other boy within five pounds and that was Hector Pons. They battled back and forth, a very close match with Hector coming in with a victory. Yoji Mochizuki and Darren Belskis came away with the next two weight classes, 65 and 75 respectively. At 85 pounds Borja Oyarzabal squeaked out an overtime win over Adam Ramsay in the semi-finals. Gonzalo Rainer was his next victim for the championship. Eric West won handedly in the 98 pound weight class. At 108 pounds, Jacobo Calderon defeated Diego Campo who had beaten Jacobo in the Maroon and Grey dual match. Jeff Boyer swept the 115 pound weight class with a 47 second pin in the finals. To get to the finals of the 125 pound weight class, Ted Devoe pinned three opponents in a total of 49 seconds. Joe Rini gave him a fantastic match in the finals but fell short by a decision of 9-6. The two most experienced wrestlers in camp, Ryan Nanri and Steve Lenard, met in the 132 pound weight class. Single takedowns, switches, stand-ups and half nelsons were executed with fine precision. The crowd was on their feet the whole three minute match with Ryan winning 11-5.

Tom Baleztena and Matt McCracken won the next matches at 145 pounds and 160 pounds by scores of 12-2 and 6-4. Matt was unsure of his ability at first and was going to withdraw from the tournament. He applied the moves and techniques he learned from this summer to defeat three opponents for the blue ribbon. The final weight class at Heavyweight was filled with studs. Trevor Cooke, the heaviest wrestler in camp at 210 pounds was defeated by 171 pound Michel Diaz in the semi-finals by a score of 21-6, a technical fall. However, Michel was no match for Jose Martin who won by forfeit over Trey Griley and pinned Manuel Perez in the first two rounds. In the final, Jose won by pin in the last period for first place.

The tournament was a great success and we hope the boys use what they learned in other sports in school.

## Hank Aaron League by Darin Lutz

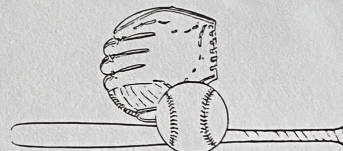
