ANNOUNCING THE GREY-MAROON **CAPTAINS**




1992 COUNSELORS-IN-TRAINING PROGRAM

GREY-MAROON WRESTLING

The Grey-Maroon wrestling meet was one of the most exciting ever. The team captains matched strategy and put their most experienced wrestlers against each other. The weight classes ranged from sixty pounds to one hundred and seventy pounds

(heavyweight).

During the meet the coaches had to balance their athletes between basketball and baseball games. Some made the mistake of playing a full half of basketball before their match like Brendon Flynn at 150 pounds. Brendon squeaked out a win over Clint Mondell because of his past wrestling experience. Russell Twiss had to take off his sweatshirt to make his weight class at 60 pounds to receive a forfeit from Hector Pons. Alex Green from Beaver Lodge used skill and strength to overcome Brad Fichter of Hawk 11-4. At 80 pounds Nacho Prieto and Tom Papa rumbled back and forth with Nacho coming out on top 3-2 for the third consecutive win for the Greys. 




