PRE-CAMP 2001

After a heavy winter with lots of snow and a late arrival of spring, it finally became time to get the camp facilities ready for the 2001 season. Early in May several staff members started to arrive at camp to assist with the usual pre-camp clean-up and maintenance. There were several projects on the agenda this spring, but two of the main projects were the building of the new Coyote Lodge and the addition of four new elements on the ropes course. Randy Vining, a local carpenter, was responsible for building the new Coyote Lodge. It took only one week for the lodge to be put up, but once, he and his crew were done, the staining and painting had to take place which occurred just a few days before the rest of the staff arrived.

On June 12th, a Project Adventure builder came to install the new ropes elements. New to the course this year are three low elements: the Triangle Tension Traverse, the Wild Woosey, and the Swinging Tires; as well as one high element: the Pirate's Crossing. Lodge counselors and some additional staff members were able to take part in a fun team-building day on the course during pre-camp. They were able to try out many of these new elements which have proven to be quite challenging and should be a true test to everyone's abilities and determination throughout the summer.

Additional work was completed by Scott and Travis Pratt (who did some excavation work), Billy Proctor (who did some tree pruning and safety cutting). and Tom Wojcik (who got all the important water system up and running). The pre-camp crew of workers did the usual raking, painting, cleaning, and general 'getting camp ready' projects. The transformation that the camp took from the time the snow melted in the spring to the week before camp season began is amazing. Thursday, evening, June 28th, 2001, was a very special occasion at Kawanhee! It was time for the Coming of the Chief ceremony.



He extended greetings to the Kawanhee tribe, and then asked that the message for the campers of 2000 be read to the campers of 2001. All returning Sachems appeared, and along with Ted, they read the important message to the attentive audience. The message gave sound advice for having a great summer. Following the reading of the message, the Chief asked that the four fires representing North - South - East - West winds be lit. Each brave representing a wind then read an important message and lit his fire. Following this part of the ceremony, the Great Central Fire was lit. Next, the Chief spoke about the meaning of Kawanhee and emphasized that we must all give to Kawanhee before we can expect to receive something in

return. To represent the giving to Kawanhee each member of the Kawanhee tribe threw a small stick into the Central Fire as a token of his giving. As the ceremony approached its conclusion, Chief Kawanhee grasped a torch and gave his blessing three separate times - first on the hands, secondly on the minds, and finally on the hearts of each brave. These symbolic K's speak to the attitude each of us should have to derive the greatest benefits out of the summer. Finally, Chief Kawanhee disappeared into the woods. We all hope to see him again at the end of the summer. Before he appears again, each of us has a lot to think about, much to accomplish, and worthy goals to challenge us.
